

The Neighbourhood Land Trust to Lead Parkdale Hub – West Block Development Delivering new affordable homes and inclusive community space in the heart of Parkdale

Toronto, November 13, 2025 – Parkdale's <u>Neighbourhood Land Trust (NLT)</u>, Toronto's first community land trust, has been selected by the City of Toronto as the successful proponent to lease and develop the <u>Parkdale Hub</u> – West Block, a 16-storey development that will deliver an estimated 175 new homes located at 1337 Queen Street West and a portion of 1325 Queen Street West.

In partnership with St. Clare's Housing, a Toronto-based non-profit housing developer, the proposed development, known as **Parkdale People's Place**, will bring community-owned and affordable homes to one of the Toronto's most housing-pressured neighbourhoods. The project will encompass 175 purpose-built rental homes, including 88 permanently affordable, nine rental replacement and 78 rent-controlled units, alongside 23,300 sq. ft. of community space to support local services and programs.

A <u>City of Toronto</u> project led by <u>CreateTO</u>, Parkdale Hub is a multi-phase city-building initiative that will deliver new housing and a complete cultural and community hub to Queen Street West and Cowan Avenue, an area long recognized as the heart of cultural life in Parkdale. Parkdale People's Place will be the first of three phases of this vision, setting the stage for future redevelopment that strengthens the neighbourhood's social and cultural connection.

The concept for the Parkdale Hub grew out of a community-led planning process co-led by Neighbourhood Land Trust and the Parkdale People's Economy initiative, which identified the Hub as a promising site for equitable development of public space, community space and affordable housing. The project has been championed by City Councilor Gord Perks, whose ongoing support has helped bring this community vision to life.

"Parkdale People's Place is a testament to what happens when residents, non-profits, and government representatives come together around a shared vision for equitable development," said Anita Prasad, Board President, The Neighbourhood Land Trust. "By securing land in community ownership, we are making affordability permanent and ensuring that Parkdale's future remains rooted in inclusion, creativity and care. This project reflects decades of community effort to build housing that serves people first."

Parkdale People's Place will offer a range of deeply affordable, family-sized and accessible homes designed to meet the diverse needs of Parkdale residents. Tenants will live independently, with access to culturally appropriate supports and additional services coordinated through a network of proposed community referral partners, including Anishnawbe Health Toronto, Canadian Tibetan Association of Ontario, Rwandan Community Healing Centre, FCJ Refugee Centre, Community Living Toronto, Fred Victor and PARC. Developed and operated by Parkdale-based non-profits with tenant and community leadership embedded in governance, the project will ensure affordability for future generations.

"St. Clare's is proud to partner with The Neighbourhood Land Trust and the City of Toronto to contribute to the Parkdale's efforts to preserve and expand healthy affordable housing options in this vibrant and resilient community," said Andrea Adams, Executive Director, St. Clare's Housing. "This project demonstrates how collaboration between local non-profits, community partners, and government can create stable, inclusive housing that truly reflects the needs of tenants."

The project will also implement a Community Economic Benefits Plan, ensuring that investments made in this project create training and employment opportunities for local residents, as well as



supporting local businesses and social enterprises. Designed to meet the Toronto Green Standard Tier 2, the building will incorporate energy-efficient systems and resilient materials that support the City's climate goals.

"Congratulations to the Neighbourhood Land Trust, who have been selected as the proponent for Parkdale Hub-West Block to deliver approximately 175 new homes in partnership with St. Clare's," said Mayor Olivia Chow. "The project will deliver much needed affordable non-profit housing for Torontonians."
